


Greetings

Fiscal Year 2015 was an excellent year for The Family Institute at Northwestern University. It was a year of growth and expansion. Historically, the positions of CEO and President were held by the same person. This year, Bill Pinsof retained the CEO position and we hired Jana Jones as our new President. Jana brings an extensive background in healthcare and medical entrepreneurship to The Family Institute as we move into the next phase of our institutional development. This move affirms what we know will be a successful leadership transition in FY16.

Our dedication to *strengthening and healing families and individuals from all walks of life* continued during FY15. We provided over 4,000 families, couples and individuals with over 52,000 therapy and counseling sessions. Over 80 therapists-in-training from our various educational programs provided more than 16,000 sessions to over 2,100 families, couples and individuals through our Bette D. Harris Family and Child Clinic, where our average fee is \$12.00.

While our Master of Science in Marriage and Family Therapy Program was again re-accredited, our Master of Arts in Counseling Program received first-time accreditation through Council for Accreditation of Counseling and Related Educational Programs for eight years — the highest level of accreditation. We are also proud to announce that we launched the online version of our Counseling Program. This is a pioneering step for the Institute and Northwestern, in partnership with 2U, the leading organization in the country in developing online postgraduate degree programs in top tier research universities. The online program's first cohort was admitted in April 2015, and we now have over 60 students in the program. We anticipate extraordinary growth in the program.

Our research team, through the Epstein Center for Psychotherapy Change, continued to evaluate the effectiveness of our online measurement and feedback system for tracking client change, the STIC*. As the three year randomized clinical trial (RCT) draws to a close, our team is starting to analyze the incredible amount of data we collected. Our hope is that we will find evidence to support the idea that giving therapists quantitative feedback about client progress throughout the course of therapy will improve the effectiveness and efficiency of couple and individual therapy.

As we look ahead with anticipation and excitement, we also reflect on the wonderful generosity of our friends and donors. Thank you for your interest in and support of the Family Institute. Together, we continue making the world better.

fellows, therapists-in-training and non-clinical staff helped make The Family Institute a success in FY15. This is what makes the Institute a leader at the forefront of our field.





Research

The Family Institute continues to improve mental health care through clinical research. Each of our eight researchers were involved with the Dan J. Epstein Family Foundation Center for Psychotherapy Change in FY15. Many of them also conducted additional research within their areas of expertise: anxiety and panic disorders; depression, anxiety, relationship distress and couples; and the impact of relationships on health. Each of these initiatives allows the Institute to remain dedicated to intervention and to the development of improved treatments.
